What you missed.....

If you did not attend the May 4th, 2011 CJER-APICS PDM presentation, “**LEAN performance Indicators–A Road Map for Supply Chain and Operation Success**” presented by Howard Forman, then you missed an exciting and lively evening. Howard Forman, President of PIM Associates, INC. has over 30 years of experience in the operational and supply chain environments, specializing in ERP system implementations, demand planning/forecasting, inventory reduction, supply chain management, lean and business process improvements.

Howard’s presentation began with a discussion about actually using road maps and/or GPS devices to get somewhere when you’re traveling in your car. Trip planning becomes an important process when you’re going somewhere that you’ve never been before. Relating trip planning to those tools that will help you get to where you want to go, Howard starting talking about defining your Lean Performance Indicators. These included; what to measure, what not to measure, the importance in identifying, quantifying, and recognizing opportunities that would expose waste along the way.

What are LEAN Performance Indicators? According to Howard they are:

Measurements that support and facilitate achieving strategic corporate goal and objectives.

- Process motivators and drivers**
- Provide an early warning system**
- Drive performance improvements**
- Help to expose and quantify waste**
- Agreed upon form of communications**
- Performance provides competitive advantage**

Howard passed out remote controls to all in attendance and everyone participated in responding to several LEAN questions relating to his/her own company. The anonymous results were then revealed and discussed. He provided us with a few samples of LEAN Performance Indicators that we explored in further detail. Howard left us with some final LEAN Performance Indicators and closing thoughts ; that identified LEAN performance indicators should focus on the future, they should be customer based, and there should be specific identified goals to reduce waste yet be able to enhance reliability, growth and profit margins for the organization.

The basic concepts in managing the complete flow of materials in a supply chain from suppliers to customers are covered in the Basics module. Supply chain concepts are introduced and basic terminology emphasized, as are relationships among activities in the supply chain. Introduction to Supply Chain Management

The core competency modules

MPR – Master Planning of Resources (8 sessions @ 3 hours each)

Explore the processes used to develop sales and operations plans and identify and assess internal and external demand and forecasting requirements. The course focuses on the importance of producing achievable master schedules that are consistent with business policies, objectives, and resource constraints.

DSP – Detail Scheduling and Planning (9 sessions @ 3 hours each)

Focus on the various techniques for material and capacity scheduling. Study detailed descriptions of material requirements planning (MRP), capacity requirements planning (CRP), inventory management practices, and procurement and supplier planning.

ECO – Execution and Control (9 sessions @ 3 hours each)

Focus on the areas of prioritizing and sequencing work, executing work plans and implementing controls, reporting activity results, and providing feedback on performance. The course explains techniques for scheduling and controlling production processes, the execution of quality initiatives and continuous improvement plans, and the control and handling of inventories.

The capstone

SMR – Strategic Management of Resources (8 sessions @ 3 hours each)

Explore the relationship of existing and emerging processes and technologies to manufacturing strategy and supply chain-related functions. The course addresses three main topics: aligning resources with the strategic plan, configuring and integrating operating processes to support the strategic plan, and implementing change.

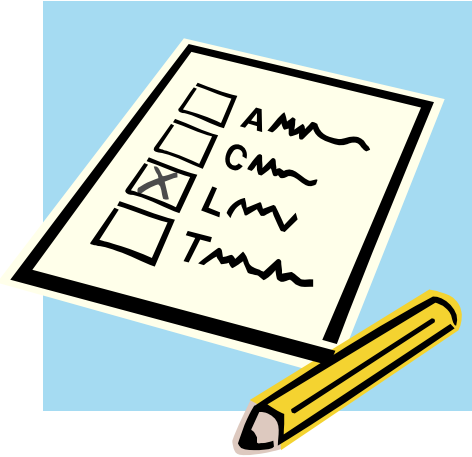
